Message from the Pastor:

St. Joseph's parish involvement in faith formation of our schools and its children has four key dimensions: sacramental preparation, school masses, classroom visits and offering the sacraments.

We offer sacramental preparation for those receiving their First Holy Communion (Grade2 students) and share the work with the schools in preparing the Grade 7 students to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

Our primary role is to foster an encounter with the Lord, and to teach the children the importance of recognizing God in their lives. School Masses are a great opportunity to do this, both through the beauty of the Liturgy and the real presence of our Lord in the Eucharist. By

doing this, we introduce the children to communal prayer and lay the groundwork for them so that they can build their own strong relationship with God through personal prayer. We also want to have the young people experience the Mass in their parish Church, and for this reason we have requested that at least one of our four yearly school Masses take place at St. Joseph Parish.

The parish's final and perhaps most important role is to make the sacraments readily available to the children. We do this by pointing out to them the days and times of our sacramental preparation (Masses, Reconciliation, etc.). Hopefully, this will prepare them to take ownership of their spiritual lives and to live a sacramental life where they may truly grow and flourish. We look forward to collaborating with our schools in this endeavor throughout the year.

Catholic Social Teachings of the Church root our actions in supporting human dignity and the preferential option of the poor which calls us to serve the most vulnerable in the world.

St. Joseph Catholic Elementary School supports Sharelife by raising funds on special dress down days for staff, spirit week events, special celebrations, and games. In addition, we provide community outreach by participating in our Annual Terry Fox Marathon of Hope, collecting canned/non-perishable food donations for Thanksgiving and Easter, gift card donations for Christmas for neighbours in need. We collaborate with St. Vincent de Paul Society for St. Joseph Parish, Mississauga Food Bank, Dr. Simone's Canadian Food for Children Halloween Candy Drive, Human Family in Christ (parish donation), and support neighbours in need through our Social Work Department.

Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues, we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

Each month, classes will celebrate the virtue of the month during class liturgies and school wide assemblies. Our virtues are lived daily inour positive interactions with each other, shared in our weekly update, prayed daily on the morning announcements, and shared with the community in our monthly newsletters. Students who exemplify the virtue of the month receive a special certificate from their teacher.

Visible Signs of our Faith:

Through symbol and service, we are instruments of God's love whose work within our communities stands as a witness to our faith.

We have a variety of visible signs of our faith including:
